

Pymble Heights Conservation Area - C8A (KLEP 2015) & C8B (KLEP (LC) 2012)

The Pymble Heights heritage conservation area is of historical significance as it represents the high quality housing development for wealthy families which followed closely on the opening of Pymble railway station on 1 January 1890. Both Hoffbank at 33 Church Street and Kiewa at 29 Church Street, were constructed for the wealthy woolbroker Duncan Carson. The conservation area demonstrates a largely intact portion of the 1892 Pymble Heights Estate subdivision, encompassing 18 listed heritage items, with particularly intact Victorian, Federation and Inter-war period housing. The area demonstrates a high degree of historic and aesthetic significance with development dating from the late nineteenth through to the late twentieth century.
