

FROM THE MAYOR

Like many places in Sydney, Ku-ring-gai continues to face some pretty significant challenges.

Declining infrastructure, increased demands to deliver more housing, and cost-shifting from the State Government has forced councils to deliver more with less.

This is not just a challenge for Ku-ring-gai Council but for all councils across the state. The local government sector continues to advocate for greater financial sustainability, including increased funding from state and federal government, reform of the rating system and less cost-shifting.

Despite these challenges, our Council remains focused on the issues that matter most to you.

Your rates are hard at work, making Ku-ring-gai one of the best places to live. We continue to invest in critical community services including libraries, childcare, youth and seniors programs, art and cultural programs, environmental and sustainability programs, waste management, business support and community events.

In 2025-26, you can expect to see upgrades to local roads, traffic improvements, streetscaping and revitalisation of local centres. There will be upgrades to parks, footpaths

toilets and amenities, along with major drainage and stormwater upgrades.

We will continue to invest in upgrades of sporting facilities, parks and playgrounds across Ku-ring-gai.

Work will commence on the Cultural and Environmental Education Centre at St Ives Showground and we will also begin master planning for recreational use of the former bowling club sites in Gordon and Roseville.

The success of our work will rely on your active involvement, so please continue to have your say on projects on public exhibition.

Your local knowledge, experience and insights continue to inform the decisions we make and the projects and services we deliver.

Finally, I want to say a huge thank you to all of the wonderful volunteers in our community who continue to make Ku-ring-gai a great place to live.

New Community Strategic Plan for Ku-ring-gai

Council has adopted a new 10 year Community Strategic Plan (CSP) and supporting plans, following consultation with residents, business, ratepayers, community groups and government agencies.

The CSP is a long-term, high-level plan that outlines the community's vision and aspirations for the future of the area, including protecting the natural environment, managing balanced growth, enhancing infrastructure, fostering social cohesion, and ensuring transparent governance.

The plan provides Council with a clear strategic direction to align its services, policies and programs with community needs and priorities, as well as state and regional planning priorities. It also acts as a guide for government agencies, investors, businesses, community groups and residents in their planning and delivery of services for the area and opportunities for collaboration and partnerships with Council.

Council has given in-principle support to a third party infrastructure provider EVIE Networks to install four new EV charging stations.

The proposed locations are on Council land in Wahroonga, Turramurra. East Killara and Roseville.

The new chargers will join a growing list of charging infrastructure available in Ku-ring-gai, including Council supported chargers at Lindfield Village Green, Ku-ring-gai Fitness and Aquatic Centre, Turramurra Library and North Turramurra Recreation Area.

Hassall Park upgrade

Stage 1 of St Ives' Hassall Park Landscape Masterplan is complete with new play spaces, paths and fencing, seating, a picnic shelter, BBQ facilities, fitness station, extra car spaces and tree plantings. The playground includes new climbing equipment, a bouldering pillar, caterpillar climber, slide and accessible carousel.

Lorraine Taylor Reserve playground

The local playground at St Ives has just reopened, with multi-functional play equipment, accessible carousel, swings, trampoline, nature play, new softfall, landscaping, seating, a water fountain and new plants.



New Eldinhope Green playground

A fun new playground is now open in Wahroonga, with a new multi-functional slide, swing with baby seat, springer, a spinning climbing net and balance beam, bubbler and seating.

Princes Park pitch improvements

The upgrade of Princes Park at Lindfield is now complete, ready for winter and summer sports. With drainage improvements and laser leveling, Princes Park is now able to withstand wet weather.

New life for Pymble landmark

One of Ku-ring-gai's local historic landmarks is available for community hire following a major upgrade.

Ku-ring-gai Town Hall – which began life as a Spanish Mission-style Roman Catholic church in 1934 – has been renovated inside and out, including a new kitchen.

Ku-ring-gai Council has launched a new payment system to make paying rates easier than ever.


Payble is a new online payment system that allows you to pay in weekly, fortnightly or monthly instalments, or make a simple one-off payment.


You can set up recurring payments via credit card, debit card or direct debit from your bank account.
