garbage collection in the area during the period of the road closure.

7. Access to all properties near the proposed closure should be maintained at all times. Emergency vehicles being given unimpeded access into the area during

the closure.

8. Energy Australia supply Public Liability insurance cover of \$20 million, naming Ku-ring-gai Council as principal. A certificate of currency is to be sighted by

Council's Director Technical Services before the work is commenced.

9. The Local Area Commander Ku-ring-gai be requested to patrol the area and

monitor traffic conditions during the road closure.

10. A Regulatory Officer visiting the site during the closure to monitor traffic

conditions and to ensure Council's conditions of approval are being observed.
