Dear Resident,

Coonanbarra Road, Wahroonga - Proposal to extend 'No Parking' restrictions on the eastern side of the street.

Council is seeking your input on a proposal to extend the existing 'No Parking 7:00am to 5:00pm Sat – Sun, April - September' restrictions on the eastern side of Coonanbarra Road, Wahroonga.

Background

Council has received concerns regarding traffic congestion and safety during sporting events at Carrington Park. Vehicles currently park on both sides of Coonanbarra Road, and those parked at 90-degree angles on the park (western) side significantly reduce the available road width. When combined with parallel parking on the eastern side, the road effectively becomes a narrow, single-lane passage for two-way traffic, making it difficult for motorists and residents to navigate safely.

Coonanbarra Road is approximately 7 metres wide, with approximately 3 - 4 metre-wide nature strip on the western side adjacent to Carrington Park. While some sections of the nature strip are clear, others are obstructed by low trees and shrubs. Vehicles parking perpendicular to the roadway on this side further restrict traffic flow.

On the eastern side, the road is bordered by a mixture of retaining walls and sloping terrain, which makes it difficult, and potentially unsafe for passengers to exit vehicles.

Proposed changes

To improve safety and traffic flow during peak periods, particularly on weekends during the sporting season, Council proposes extending the existing parking restrictions southwards to the intersection with Carrington Road, as illustrated in the **attached** Plan No. *Coonanbarra/TDA92/25*.
