



FROM THE MAYOR

At Ku-ring-gai we provide not just roads, rates and rubbish but also social infrastructure such as sportsfields, libraries, community facilities, services for our elderly and youth and climate resilience initiatives.

We are expected to deliver more with less. In the last 10 years, operating costs have increased 40% while rates revenue (pegged by the NSW Government) have increased 28%.

This year we will be conducting service reviews across Council's operations to identify how we can give you better quality or more volume with limited funds. An early finding is new technology to reduce the cost of maintaining our ageing drainage pipes – with expected savings of \$100m over the life of our infrastructure backlog. We should be proud of our Council staff's achievements.

Despite these savings, we face other cost pressures to deliver infrastructure. To create more homes, the NSW Government has imposed new planning controls that will significantly increase our population and demand for facilities, but without funding for infrastructure to match. New residents will pay the State a few hundred million in housing contributions, but the State has committed to reinvesting this across Greater Sydney - not in local infrastructure.

We are not opposed to development, but our view is that infrastructure must be properly planned and funded and residents consulted in the decision.

This year's Council elections are on Saturday 14 September. All ratepayers can vote so long as they are on the electoral roll. To find out more visit **elections.nsw.gov.au**

Housing update

The NSW Government has released new planning controls for the supply of new housing across Sydney. The government has set a minimum target of 7,600 new homes for Ku-ring-gai to be built within the next five years.

The planning controls mean mid-rise apartment blocks can be built on sites within 400 metres of Gordon, Lindfield, Roseville and Killara railway stations.

The low and mid-rise housing provisions are due to come into effect later this year. They also propose some mid-rise apartments, terraces and manor houses (two storey apartment blocks) on sites within 800 metres of train stations and St Ives Shopping Village.

Dual occupancies would also be allowed in most residential zones across NSW, providing a site is larger than 450 square metres.
